AGRICULTURE RECOGNITION ACTON FAIR APPRECIATION AWARDS TO YORK COUNTY AGRICULTURAL LEADERS The Libby Family and Libby and Son U-Picks, Donald, Michael & Aaron Libby

Three generations of the Libby family have been commercially growing fruit in Limerick since the 1940's. At the young age of 12 Donald Libby started working on a local apple orchard owned by relatives of First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt. The orchard was purchased in the 1950's by the Hall Brothers, of Hall & Cole Produce and incorporated as Three Hills Apple Orchard. Don cared for the orchard the next 40+ years. Michael, like his father Don, worked on the orchard from a very young age. After pursuing other careers, Mike returned to the orchard full time. In the late 1970's the farm diversified by arowing highbush blueberries. Through the 80's & 90's many bushels of apples and many tons of blueberries were picked, boxed and shipped throughout New England. Local markets and pick your own options were expanding with each passing year. By the late 90's the Hall Family had decided to sell the orchard, mostly for the value of the property. Don retired in 1999 and that would be the last harvest season for Three Hills Orchard. After retirement Don remains around the orchard helping in any way he can. Facing employment uncertainty, Mike chose to purchase the highbush blueberry part of the orchard. The goal from day one for Mike was to transform the reliance on wholesale to retail/pick your own. Like his grandfather and father before him Aaron started working on the orchard at a young age. Aaron is a current member of the Maine State Pomological Society Executive Committee and Past President and in 2020 he was the recipient of US Apple Association Young Grower's Initiative and Fruit Grower's News 40 Under 40. While serving in the Maine Legislature Aaron submitted and was successful in passing Limited Liability for Agritourism bill into law. Since 2000 Libby's Farm has been operating as Libby & Son U-Picks, a pick your own fruit farm with fun for the whole family. Twice Libby's has been voted in the USA Today's Top 10 Apple Orchards in the country and is nominated for the third straight year.




Roger Boucher

Farming was always in Roger's genes. In 1980 Roger became involved with the 4-H Beef Club and helping with the 4-H Livestock barn at the fair. In 2003 he assisted the club in getting a grant which started the construction of the first chicken hatchery at the fair. Within two years' time it was obvious it needed to

expand and he built the octagon incubator which can be found in the Exhibit Hall today. Roger watched and cared for hundreds of chicks that have been hatched over time. He loved chatting with everyone who came to see them and was always available to answer any questions and help whenever needed.





- All Beef, Dairy, Sheep and Goat Shows open & 4-H will be open to all Maine and New Hampshire Counties.
- Entries of Handicraft, Art, Flowers, Fruits, Vegetables and Farm Displays will be received on Tuesday from 9 A.M. to 8 P.M. and on Wednesday from 9 A.M. until Noon.
- The 4-H Hall Exhibits must be in the building by 7 P.M. Tuesday.
- Grange Agricultural and Domestic exhibits must be in place by 8 p.m. Tuesday. Judging will be Wednesday.
- All livestock entries, including pulling and show animals, should be sent to the Superintendent of the department you are entering in by August 1, with your certificate of \$1,000,000.00 liability insurance.

- Our kiddle tractor pull is a fun time for boys and girls.
- Registration for all classes will close at the start of the pull.
- Each contestant will pedal the tractor and sled (with weights) as far as they can down the runway.
- In the event that more than one contestant goes the full length of the runway there will be a pull-off with more weight added to the sled. This will continue until one contestant pulls the greatest distance with the most weight on the sled.
- There will be 4 divisions as follows:
 - ~ Boys weighing 40 pounds and under.
 - ~ Boys weighing 41 to 50 pounds.

Health Requirements for Livestock and Poultry

• All livestock trailers will be parked next to the fence in the campground. Domestic animals and poultry showing signs of external or internal parasites and/or contagious diseases, and other domestic animals and poultry having been in contact with these animals may be ordered removed and may be quarantined at the discretion of the Commissioner.

• Domestic animals and poultry shall not be permitted on fairgrounds, livestock and poultry shows and exhibitions if they originate from a herd or flock under quarantine.

• All poultry for exhibition must originate from flocks that have an official Pullorum-typhoid clean rating.

• All equines originating from within the State must have a current negative Coggins or E.L.I.S.A. test done within 36 months. Equines entering the state must have a negative Coggins or E.L.I.S.A. test done within six (6) months of entry into Maine.

• Livestock and poultry originating outside the State of Maine must meet the requirements for entry into the state. Permits, health and testing requirements may be obtained from the Division of Veterinary Services at (207) 287-3701 or Fax: (207) 287-7548.

• <u>We strongly recommend that all animals for exhibition purposes be</u> vaccinated for rabies by a veterinarian prior to exhibition where a rabies vaccine exists for that species.

• Potential for exposure to disease does exist at fairs. It is also recommended that exhibitors protect their flocks and herds by vaccinating their animals against contagious diseases. This is best done under the supervision of a veterinarian. We also suggest an isolation period before exhibited animals are reintroduced to the home herd or flock.

- All bulls must be registered.
- Grade females may be shown.



A certificate of \$1,000,000.00 liability insurance must accompany the open entry form. DO NOT send the certificate of insurance to the extension office.
- All 4-H Beef and Dairy animals must be stalled in the 4-H barn. NO EXCEPTIONS.a. All registered animals must be registered in the 4-H member's name.
 b. Leased animals must have lease forms.
- All animals, except poultry, rabbits and cavies will be identified by an ear tag, tattoo number or registration number and be recorded in the Extension Office by June 30. All exhibitors must present embossed animal approval form.
- 4. Danish system of scoring will be used for all exhibits
- 5. Entries must be the work of the current 4-H year.
- All animals including working steers, must be on the fairgrounds by 8:30 A.M. Thursday and remain until 6:00 PM Sunday in order to receive premium checks.


